

Raymond College 2019 Reunion

Welcome to the Raymond College Reunion! You will pick up official information when you register on Saturday, but here is enough to get you started. (Reminder, bring cash or checks for book sales...)

Friday

- 3:45 – 4:00 Meet in the hotel lobby to carpool to reception at The Write Place, 343 E. Main Street, downtown Stockton, 95202.
Turn right onto Fremont from the hotel. Right onto Center Street, right onto Miner Ave, right onto Sutter Street. The Write Place is the northwest corner of Main and Sutter. Park on the street, or in one of the parking lots one block south on Market St.
- 6:00 Leave The Write Place, carpool to Wendi Maxwell's house, 1129 W. Walnut Street, central Stockton, 95203 for light dinner.
From Miner, proceed west (left). Turn right on El Dorado (one way going north). Turn left onto Park Street (one way going west). Continue on Park Street to Pershing Ave. Turn right onto Pershing, then left onto Harding Way. Turn left onto San Jose, then left onto Walnut. Park on the street. 1129 is the third house from the park on the north (right) side. Park on the street.
- 9:30 or 10:00 ish – Return to hotel.
Turn left onto Orange street, then right onto Harding Way, then left on Pershing. Continue to Fremont Street. Turn left, proceed to the hotel.

Turn left onto Fremont. Continue to Pershing. Turn right onto Pershing. Continue to the stop light at Alpine, which becomes Larry Heller Drive where it enters campus. Turn right onto campus, proceed to the Vershagin Alumni House. No parking sticker needed.
